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## How to travel by public transport in Lisbon

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The city of Lisbon is served by a network of modern public transportation which provides excellent mobility both within the city center and its surrounding suburbs. Of this, the **Metro** is significant with its four lines (Green, Blue, Yellow and Red) connecting the riverfront, the north of the city and the suburbs of Amadora and Odivelas. Various art projects, such as panels of tiles by contemporary artists, are installed at the stations which also have security cameras, information posts and ticket machines. The stations are open between 6:30am and 1:00am.

Other ways to get around the city are **tram**, **bus** and **funicular** which are all operated by **Carris**. As well as the routes which provide transportation between the center of the city and the historical area there are also special services for tourists and visitors with mobility difficulties. Do remember it is always cheaper to buy tickets and passes before the journey. For better mobility Carris and the Metro have created several passes to travel on both companies.

When travelling in Lisbon, you need to know which ticket is the right one for you.

### **Ticket paid for on entering Carris transport:**

- Bus ticket: 1,80€ EUR (valid for 1 journey)
- Tram ticket: 2,85 EUR (valid for 1 journey)
- Funicular ticket: 3,60 EUR (valid for 2 journeys)

### **Carris/Metro ticket:**

- Travel ticket: 1,40 EUR (+ 0,50 EUR card viva viagem), valid for one hour starting from the time of first validation.

### **Other travel cards:**

- Daily ticket Carris/Metro: 6 EUR (valid for 24 hours for all the Carris/Metro network)
- Zapping: Used for various types of transports such as Carris/Metro, boats and trains. A rechargeable ticket, minimum 3 EUR, maximum 40 EUR. The price of your journey is deducted from the ticket each time it is used.

### **Important to note:**

- All tickets are for individual use only and are not transferrable.
- Ticket validation is mandatory.
